



All Wound Up



Materials - 42"-wide fabric

- 3/4 yd. light background
- 3/8 yd. pink
- 1/2 yd. purple
- 1/2 yd. border
- 3/8 yd. binding
- 1 1/4 yds. backing


Block size: 9"
Quilt size: 33"

Cutting

All strips are cut selvage to selvage. Measurements include 1/4" seams.


From light background fabric, cut

- 2 strips, 3 7/8" wide for E/E units. See step 5.
- 3 strips, 3 3/8" wide. Subcut into 18 rectangles 5 3/4" long. Cut rectangles once diagonally for piece C.




From pink fabric, cut

- 1 strip, 3 1/2" wide. Subcut into 9 squares.
- 2 strips, 2 1/2" wide. OPEN STRIPS to a single layer, right sides up. Subcut into 18 rectangles 4 1/4" long. Cut rectangles once diagonally, as shown for piece A.



From purple fabric, cut

- 2 strips, 3 7/8" wide for E/E units. See step 5.
- 2 strips, 2 1/2" wide. OPEN STRIPS to a single layer, right sides up. Subcut into 18 rectangles 4 1/4" long. Cut rectangles once diagonally in the opposite direction, as shown for piece B.



From border print, cut

- 4 strips, 4" wide.

From binding fabric, cut


- 4 strips, 2 1/4" wide.

Piecing

1. This seam allowance test is suggested before beginning: Cut and sew three strips, 1 1/2" wide (x 5" long) together. They must equal 3 1/2" exactly. Adjust seam allowance, if necessary.


2. Sew the A triangle to the C triangle, matching angles precisely. Start stitching at the broad edge of the C triangle rather than at the point. The smaller A triangle will be underneath. Sewing will be through a single layer of fabric on patch C for about an inch. Note: The broad end of the C triangle will point in two different directions. Ignore this as you sew. There is excess fabric here that will be trimmed off in step 4.




Flip over and begin sewing from this end.

3. Press the seam allowance toward the A triangle. Hold the point straight while pressing. Press carefully to avoid tucks, particularly at the point. Do not trim the point until after the B triangle is sewn on. The point is needed to align the B triangle.


4. Add a B triangle, matching the three narrow points precisely. Start stitching at the broad end of the C triangle. The small B triangle will now be on top. Press the seam allowance toward the B triangle.



5. Using the Thirtysomething Square Up tool, simply align the inner set of angled lines marked 3" with the seams of the unit. Trim the C triangle and any excess fabric adjacent to it. Trim the excess seam allowance where the three points meet.



6. Place the light background and purple 3 7/8" strips, right sides together and press lightly. Cut 3 7/8" squares, then cut the squares once diagonally for E/E units. Sew 1/4" from the long bias edge of the triangle pairs. Press seam allowance toward the purple.



7. Piece 9 blocks.

8 Sew the blocks together into three rows of three blocks each. Sew the rows together and add borders.
